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U.S. Military Partnerships With the World

The U.S. military presence across the globe serves as the main pillar of international stability and peace.

- **Forward-deployed U.S. forces** play a pivotal role in forging alliances and building networks of partnership and international cooperation. NATO in Europe, along with bilateral military treaties with Japan, South Korea, and Australia in the Indo-Pacific, stand as some of the prime examples of these enduring commitments.
- **Since 1945, forward-deployed forces** have been instrumental in deterring aggression and preventing major conflicts, particularly in regions prone to instability.
- Along with the U.S Army, Air Force, Marine Corps, Space Force, and the National Guard, **the U.S. Navy** has also been holding a crucial role in securing vital global chokepoints—including the Strait of Hormuz, the Strait of Malacca, and the South China Sea—both independently and through multinational initiatives including:
 - NATO Allied Maritime Command (MARCOM)
 - Standing NATO Maritime Group one (SNMG1)
 - Standing NATO Maritime Group two (SNMG2)
 - The Combined Maritime Forces (CMF),
 - The United States Pacific Fleet (USPACFLT), and independently.
 - The U.S Navy has been also providing Operational Support and the Replenishment at Sea to European Naval Forces in Operation Atalanta countering piracy.

These efforts keep international trade routes open and secure while deterring conflict between regional powers.

The Presence and Contributions of the U.S. Army and Air Force in the World

Beyond their combat operations and battlefield roles, the U.S. Army and Air Force—through regional bilateral and multilateral treaties and defense cooperation agreements—have been major contributors to humanitarian relief efforts worldwide.

The Air Force, with its airlift capabilities, particularly through aircraft like the C-17 and C-130, has delivered food, medical supplies, and disaster relief to regions devastated by earthquakes, hurricanes, famine, civil conflict, and other crises. From the Berlin Airlift to the ongoing ***Operation Christmas Drop***, the longest-running humanitarian airlift operation in world history, the U.S. Air Force stands as a leading force in international humanitarian relief efforts.

The Army, with its unmatched land power, has served not only as a liberator but—through its **Corps of Engineers**—as a rebuilders of nations devastated by war, civil conflict, and natural disaster. Its history spans the two World Wars, the Korean and Vietnam Wars, the Gulf War, the wars in Iraq and Afghanistan, and its ongoing NATO peacekeeping mission in Kosovo.

With the global footprint across Europe, the Indo-Pacific, the Middle East, Africa, and the Americas, the Army plays a vital role in strengthening regional partnerships and maintaining peace and security worldwide.

Alongside the Air Force, the Army stands at the forefront of International Disaster Response and Humanitarian Relief Operations, delivering critical aid wherever it is needed most.

The State Partnership Program (SPP)

Established in 1993, the State Partnership Program (SPP) is the Department of Defense initiative that enables the National Guard of every U.S. State to have a long term and mutual partnerships and a military-to-military engagements with a specific country across the globe. This partnership encompasses all areas of civil and military components, opening the pathways to robust engagements between the U.S Armed Forces and the military of the partner countries.

The U.S. National Guard has global military partnerships **with over 116* nations in every continent:**

- Africa;
- Asia;
- Central Asia;
- Europe (Eastern, Western, Central, and the Baltic Region);
- Western Hemisphere.

The United States maintains the world's most extensive unmatched forward military presence, providing stability, deterrence, and partnership to allies and partners across Every region in the world.

For over eight decades up to the present time, the forward presence of U.S. military forces have been a cornerstone of the international peace and stability —detering aggression, reassuring allies, and securing freedom of navigation and commerce, essential to global prosperity.

From Europe to Middle East, Africa, the Indo-Pacific, and beyond, the U.S. military presence does more than project power;

**it mitigates risks that would otherwise overwhelm individual nations,
and creates a stable environment where peace and security are
maintained, and diplomacy, trade, and international cooperation can
flourish.**

Among the U.S. Military's Missions Across the Globe:

- Delivering rapid humanitarian assistance and disaster relief to communities in their moment of greatest need;
- Safeguarding the world's sea lanes and undersea infrastructure, ensuring global commerce and communication remain secure and open.

Beyond deterrence, this forward posture delivers a broad public good, prepositioned forces and logistics.

The U.S military partnerships with the various regions and countries create the alliances of shared investment and shared rewards. Simultaneously the host nations gain the stability that attracts investment and trade to their economies.

Security & Deterrence

Protecting allies from aggression

- Forward Deployed Forces act as a credible deterrent against adversarial military action.
- Mutual defense commitments like the one under NATO or other multinational treaties, as well as the bilateral cooperations have helped to prevent large-scale conflicts for decades.
- U.S. presence in the Indo Pacific region deters provocations and maintains freedom of navigation in the critical international sea lanes.
- Rapid-response capabilities allow the U.S. to quickly reinforce allies facing emerging threats.
- Combined military exercises strengthen interoperability and readiness among partner nations.
- Integrated air and missile defenses shield allied territories and populations from incoming threats.
- Extended deterrence reassures partners and reinforces nonproliferation across key regions and around the world.

Humanitarian Aid and Disaster Relief

U.S. military as the first responder during the crisis

➤ **Support during Natural Disaster**

Earthquake, tsunami response: U.S. military assets , ships, helicopters, and engineering units — have provided critical search and-rescue and logistics support after disasters in Haiti, Nepal, Indonesia, Japan, and elsewhere in the world.

➤ **Medical Assistance**

Hospital ships like the USNS Mercy and USNS Comfort: the U.S Navy has delivered free medical care to tens of thousands of civilians across Southeast Asia, Latin America, and Africa.

➤ **Emergency Support in the Pandemic**

During COVID-19 pandemic: U.S. forces have assisted partner nations with vaccine distribution, logistics, and field hospital construction during the pandemic.

➤ **Airlift and Mass Evacuation**

Rapid airlift and sealift: U.S. forces have evacuated civilians from conflict zones and delivered foods, water, and emergency shelter to remote regions cut off by large-scale crises.

➤ **Refugee and Displacement Support**

Shelter and protection: U.S. forces have established and secured refugee camps, supplying clean water, sanitation, and temporary housing for populations displaced by conflict, war, or disaster.

➤ **Rebuilding and Infrastructure Repair**

Engineering support: Military engineering units have restored roads, bridges, power, and water systems, helping disaster-struck communities recover and resume daily life.

Economic and Diplomatic Benefits

Local Economic Impact

- U.S. bases inject billions into host countries local economies through wages, construction, and procurement.
- Host-nation businesses benefit from contracts, services, and the purchasing power of military personnel.
- Infrastructure built for bases, roads, ports, utilities — often benefits surrounding communities.
- Thousands of local jobs are created directly on bases and indirectly across nearby service industries.
- Skills training and technology transfer raise the long-term productivity of the host-nation workforce.

Diplomatic Leverage

- A U.S. presence signals commitment and strengthens alliance relationships.
- Joint training and exercises build trust and people-to-people connections between militaries.
- The U.S. military presence also enables rapid diplomatic support during crises, giving host nations confidence.
- Basing agreements give partners standing forums to coordinate policy and resolve disputes before they escalate.
- A visible commitment reassures partners, and discourages coercion by rival powers in contested regions.

Stability and Rule of Law and Building Institutional Capacity

Security Sector Assistance: Training and equipping host-nation forces builds long-term capacity, reducing dependence on sustained U.S. deployments.

Maritime Security: U.S. naval presence helps protect shipping lanes vital to global trade, combating piracy and illegal trafficking.

Peacekeeping Support: U.S. military's support to UN and regional peacekeeping missions has helped to end or contain several conflicts, like in the peacekeeping mission in Kosovo.

Rule of Law & Governance: U.S. military advisors help partner nations strengthen courts, police, and border controls, reinforcing accountable and transparent institutions.

Countering Violent Extremism: Civil-military programs address the root causes of radicalization through education, local development, and community engagement.

Technology and Innovation

Enhancing interoperability and military advancement

- **Interoperability:** Forward-deployed forces keep allied militaries on shared systems, standards, and procedures, which can facilitate the coalitions to operate as one in any crises.
- **Joint Exercises:** Overseas exercises field-test new technologies in real-world conditions, accelerate the rapid adoption across allied forces.
- **Technology Transfer:** Co-production deals and basing agreements transfer cutting-edge defense systems and technical expertise to partner-nations' industries, which increases the local workforce and self-reliance.
- **Emerging Capabilities:** Forward partnerships speed allied adoption of AI, autonomous systems, and space- and cyber-based capabilities for future deterrence.
